

Hi everyone. Here is a detailed supply list and suggested vendors.

ROPE: For this project we will be working with a thick cord. It is my preference that we use natural materials. We will use **3ply, 5mm cotton cord. You will need about 600' of cord.**

My favorite vendors for high quality rope are:

- **Ganxxet (a small woman owned business in Miami FL).** They have a lot of color choices and their fiber is of a great quality. Their 5mm fiber comes in 150' rolls. You will need 4 rolls for 600'.
<https://www.ganxxet.com> click on shop, scroll down MACRAME until you see "Cotton Rope 3 ply, 5 mm / 6 mm. Any color will do, for this project please choose 4 rolls of the SAME color. \$12 per roll for a total of \$60
- **Modern Macrame (a small woman owned business on the West Coast).**
<https://www.modernmacrame.com> click on shop materials, scroll to **5mm Cotton Rope 600'**. They also have a lot of color choices. \$72 for 600'

WEAVING MATERIALS

You have a wide variety of choices here. For my projects I typically choose a combination of:

- **1-2 colors of Merino Wool Roving (about 2 ounces total).** My favorite vendors are:
<https://www.ganxxet.com> <https://www.livingfelt.com> If you are interested in a hand dyed variegated roving (I personally love this stuff) please browse Etsy for a vendor.
- **Assorted yarns of varying thicknesses** (these yarns can be made of any fiber and can easily be found at local craft stores and knitting shops. Here is an opportunity to get creative. Shiny, fuzzy, thick, thin, eyelash, novelty yarns etc. Even strips of upcycled fabrics work beautifully. Please note: Don't spend a lot of money here. You don't need a lot of any one thing. If you have friends that knit or if you have a stash of your own...look here first! You may have everything you need right at home. If you must buy...buy small amounts or samples. What fun. You do want these yarns to coordinate with the rope color you chose for your macrame. You probably want 5-6 different yarns.

OTHER MATERIALS

- **5/8 wooden dowel cut to 14"** (save the other end as well) 😊 you may have time for more than one project! Dowels are available at any hardware store for a few dollars.
- **Notebook & pencil/pen** for sketching design ideas and/or taking notes.
- **Sturdy sharp pair of kitchen scissors** (please don't cut macrame rope with your sewing scissors)
- **Tapestry Needle** (large 6" needle with a large eye that you can thread your yards through). This is optional. I will use one only "sometimes" This can be found at craft stores.
- **Hook/Nail on the wall OR a garment rack and a pair of S hooks** I typically work from a standing position or sitting position when I macrame and my work is hanging vertically. A hook on a wall is sufficient for success. A garment rack with S hooks is very portable and you can work outside or in different areas of your house for variety. It's convenient but not necessary.

 - **S Hooks AMAZON Lysas 20 pack Round S Shaped Hooks Hangers \$9.09** (this is overkill, you only need 2—you may be able to buy 2 at the hardware store)
 - **REMEMBER: A hook on the wall is essentially FREE 😊**
