Each fleece is chosen for cleanliness and softness and treated gently to retain the original luster and spring. All yarns are hand spun, often with hand plucked Angora rabbit hair carded in. All garments are hand knitted and one-of-a-kind. All colors are the natural color of the sheep or rabbit or come from natural sources such as flowers, roots or even bugs."
